Welcome to the Good Earth Farm 2012 CSA Sign-up Form

- Of the 4 pages, 2 pages are to be sent to the farm and the other 2 pages are for your references.
- Page 1 has descriptions of the shares that we are offering for the 2012 season.
- Page 2 is for the personal and CSA share information that we need from you.
- Page 3 includes our Seriously-Short-Sign-up Survey and the Member Agreement.
- Page 4 has space to fill in your CSA information for your records, includes your copy of the Member Agreement, has a general description about pick-up site guidelines, and has contact info for the farm.



Produce Share Options:

Which share is right for you?

Standard Produce Share (SPS): Once a week mid-June - October

Expect to receive 20 weekly boxes of fresh seasonal produce from mid-June to mid/late-October. The Standard Share is packaged with the aim of providing most of the produce needs of one household of four (2 adults, 2 children) with a diverse diet, or 2 people eating a mostly plant-based diet. But, of course, people differ widely on the amount of produce they eat.

Small Produce Share (sPS): Once a week mid-June - October

Like the Standard Produce Share, the Small Produce Share is a 20 week delivery for folks who want produce on a weekly basis but want less than the Standard Share offers (Contents in the Small Share are about 70% of the Standard Share.) This share is expected to meet most of the produce needs of 1 - 2 people eating a diverse diet, or vegetable light households.

Peak Season Produce Share (PPS): Once a week August - October

The Peak Season Share is a 12 week delivery beginning at the height of Wisconsin's growing season in August and continuing through October. This share is packaged the same as the Standard Share only beginning later in the season.

EOW Produce Share: Every other week mid-June - October

The EOW Share is delivered in the same size box as the Standard Produce Share only it is delivered every other week for a total of 10 boxes. It is packaged to meet most of the produce needs of 1 - 2 people eating a diverse diet, or vegetable light households.

Extra Share Options:

When you sign up for a Produce Share you can opt to add these:

Late Season Share:

Extend your CSA! The Late Season Share is a one-time delivery of late season vegetables delivered in mid-November. Late Season shares often include garlic, onions, potatoes, winter squashes, cabbages, carrots, beets, rutabaga, and others.

Mushroom Share:

An every-other week delivery of 1 pound of mushrooms for a total of ten deliveries. Choose from either all buttons (\$40), all large portabellas (\$55), or 5 weeks of button and 5 weeks of crimini (baby portabellas) (\$45). Mushrooms are from local mushroom farm Gourmet's Delight.

Bread Share: NEW - Choose Weekly or EOW Bread shares!

Freshly-baked Artisan bread from local bakers at Renard's European Bake Shop. The 20 week Bread share consists of six weeks of Ciabatta and fourteen weeks of "Bakers' Choice" breads for a total of 20 loaves (1 loaf per week). The 10 week Bread share, delivered EOW, will include three weeks of Ciabatta and seven weeks of "Bakers' Choice" (10 total loaves, 1 per week). Past "Bakers' Choice" breads have been Sour Dough, Honey Wheat, 9 Grain, Roasted Potato, and Onion Caraway Rye. Could be these again, or something entirely new!

Food-for-Others Share:

Each season we seek out families or persons in need of fresh produce who could otherwise not afford to purchase a share. Your contribution (of any amount) to the Food-for-Others Share makes that happen. The farm matches a portion of each contribution made (we match every fourth box). Thank you for sharing!

GEF CSA Pick-up Site Guidelines

- It is your responsibility to pick up your share during your site's scheduled hours on Thursdays. The farm will not issue credit for unclaimed or forgotten shares. Unless other arrangements have been made ahead of time, produce that is not picked up during the site's scheduled hours will be distributed or donated.
- Share pick-ups are self-serve and on the honor system. Your site will be open during the scheduled hours, but your site host will not necessarily be at home.
- If you are unable to pick up your box on delivery day, make arrangements for your produce ahead of time. A few options: ask someone else to pick up your box, ask the farm to not make a box for you that week, or ask your site host to hold your box for a later pick-up that day. Site hosts are not expected to hold produce overnight.
